

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT



The students in Years 3 and 5 have just completed the NAPLAN for 2013. Much is reported in the media at this time of the year about NAPLAN with various commentators expressing their views about the usefulness or not of these assessments.

My belief is that these tests are just one measure of how students are fairing with their schooling and should be viewed in the context of their overall education. That is, take the results on board with what class teachers are telling you about the progress of your child.

NAPLAN results do give us some very good information about areas of need for students and how we are going as a whole school but I am extremely confident in saying that our teachers have a very solid understanding of the needs of students without the NAPLAN.

The staff here have very detailed knowledge of the areas of strength and areas for development of your children and you should be very confident in the ability of our staff to set directions for all students.

You will see evidence of what I mean at the end of this term when half yearly reports come home as staff are currently spending many hours compiling assessment data, together with their everyday knowledge of their students and class as a whole, to write reports.

Results of the NAPLAN are released around the end of term 3 and I am sure you will see a strong correlation between the half yearly reports and the NAPLAN report.

I have been requested by our neighbours to ask that you do not park across driveways in the afternoon as this is not only illegal but is impeding access to homes. Please be considerate of our neighbours at this very hectic time of the day. An extra hundred metres extra walk to a waiting vehicle is not a bad thing.

ENCOURAGING ENJOYMENT OF LEARNING

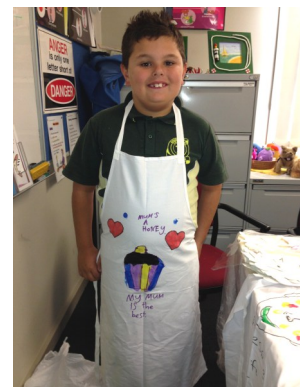

For example one week our word was "respect". The boys discussed what the word means and how that would affect our lives. We talked about the fact that if we respect people then we will listen to them and not interrupt them. Respecting people involves treating them well just like we would like people to be kind to us. Respecting people involves listening to our parents and teachers. The next activity is reading because this encourages the development of learning new words and fires up the imagination to be creative as well as helping the boys with all their subjects. Studies consistently show that those with who read books and learn to enjoy books are more likely to succeed at school. Recently we have finished reading a Tintin book. Our craft activities have included :- making pet rocks, cup cake decorating as we well as building models such as boats out of pegs. Our last craft activity was focused on making a mother's day gift which required us to design and paint an apron for mum.

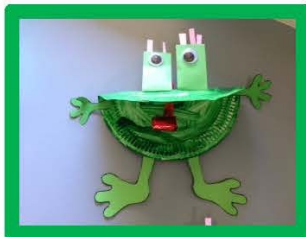
